Member Spotlight: Andrew Gipson



For July's BESTie of the month, we are pleased to spotlight Andrew Gipson, a 2nd year BMB Ph.D. student in the lab of Maureen Hanson. As part of the BEST program, Andrew has chosen to focus chiefly on the communications aspect of the program. He writes that the BEST-organized opportunities in Sci-Comm have taught him how to improve his writing, how to more effectively deliver oral presentations, and how to incorporate improv-based methods into academic presentations. In the lab Andrew is studying RNA editing, a process whereby errors in the genetic code are corrected at the RNA level to produce functional protein products. Andrew is hard at work dissecting the unique molecular mechanisms of the RNA editing machinery in plants. Outside of lab, Andrew is an avid volunteer, maintaining commitments with the Expanding Your Horizon and the New York Science and Technology Entry Program. We asked Andrew to provide a bit of science advice to his peers, and he writes: "Read every day. I've made the mistake of thinking that skimming a couple review articles would be sufficient background for a project, but since then I've realized that being on top of what's new and getting familiar with the classic studies is how you get the best ideas."
